The Holocaust - Primary Level

Our learning kits are designed to introduce the individual and their life in Europe, explain what happened to make them come to Scotland and then look at their life in Scotland after the war.

We follow the lead of the Holocaust Educational Trust (HET) to provide age-appropriate Holocaust education, which at primary level focusses on understanding pre-war Jewish life, persecution before the Second World War and individual stories of rescue and survival. The activities suggested below will be a good introduction for the themes and material in the Refugee Stories Learning Kits.

Pre-War Jewish Life & Culture

This exercise on pre-war Jewish life uses original family photographs (similar to material on which the kits are based), and looks at what life was like for Jewish families in Europe in the years just before the Second World War. The link includes guidance notes and classroom resources:
